NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING TO ALL PERSON INTERESTED IN THE REDISTRICTING AND REDUCTION OF THE SAN BERNARDINO VALLEY WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT

The San Bernardino Valley Water Conservation District (Conservation District) is required to review division boundaries after the decennial US Census. All political bodies use the same information from the US Census Bureau. The purpose of the redistricting is to insure each Division of District is as nearly equal in population as may be. The Conservation District has reviewed several scenarios and has developed a map for redistricting into five divisions. Conservation District has also adopted Resolution No. 481 "A Resolution of The Board of Directors of The San Bernardino Valley Water Conservation District, Implementing Senate Bill 235 and Ordering the Reorganization of The Divisions of The San Bernardino Valley Water Conservation District, Reducing the Number from Seven to Five" at their regular Board of Directors meeting held on September 12, 2012 pursuant to the following election code: Elections Code section 22000 a) Each district required by its authorizing act to adjust division boundaries pursuant to this section shall, by resolution, after each federal decennial census, and using that census as a basis, adjust the boundaries of any divisions so that the divisions are, as far as practicable, equal in population and in compliance with Section 1973 of Title 42 of the United States Code (VOTING RIGHTS ACT), as amended, to the extent those provisions are applicable. In adjusting the boundaries of the district, the board may give consideration to the following factors: (1) topography, (2) geography, (3) cohesiveness, contiguity, integrity, and compactness of territory, and (4) community of interests of the district. This section does not apply to districts in which only landowners vote for directors or whose directors are all elected at large or appointed. (b) The resolution specified in subdivision (a) shall be adopted by a vote of not less than a majority of the directors. A public hearing will be held on October 31, 2012 to discuss and approve the boundaries selected by the Board in the District's Board Room at 1630 West Redlands Blvd., Suite A, Redlands, CA 92373, at 1:30 pm.
